

# Allied Health Rural Generalist Accreditation Council

## Membership of the Council

### About the Council

Established as an independent council under the Services for Australian Rural and Remote Allied Health (SARRAH) corporate governance structure, the Allied Health Rural Generalist Accreditation Council (the Council) accredits post-professional entry education programs in rural generalist practice for allied health professions as part of the Allied Health Rural Generalist (AHRG) Pathway.

### Membership criteria

Council members are appointed by the SARRAH Board on the basis of their relevant experience and expertise. They are not engaged as stakeholder representatives. All Council members must hold a Director Identification Number. Members of the SARRAH Board, members of other SARRAH Board committees and employees of SARRAH are not eligible for appointment to the Council.

The roles and responsibilities of Council members include:

- Ensure they are thoroughly prepared for meetings and actively contribute to the agenda and papers, and follow up on any actions assigned to them
- Respect the role of the Chair as leader of meetings and abide by their rulings in relation to meeting procedure
- Actively contribute to discussions and decision-making
- Demonstrate fairness and a commitment to in-depth examination of all matters under review
- Provide advice in the interests of the AHRG pathway and its purpose to support rural and remote allied health workforce and their service capacity and sustainability.

### Membership terms

Council members are appointed for a term determined by the SARRAH Board for up to three (3) years and will be eligible to apply for reappointment for a maximum of three (3) consecutive terms.
